We will open the church at 10am, worship starts at 10:30am. Please go to the welcome tables for your bulletin and to share your offering (or pick up communion elements). You will not be asked to sign in.

Masks are preferred, but optional for those who are vaccinated. We ask that those NOT fully vaccinated wear masks in the building at all times.

Pews will be marked to allow for 3 feet of distancing. Please sit in open areas only. The balcony will be closed.

On Communion Sundays, we will continue to use the prefilled communion cups of grape juice and a gluten free cracker. Please use the ziploc bag to take your garbage with you.

For now, there will not be congregational singing. Special music will be provided by soloists and instrumentalists.

Please gather with others for conversation outside of the building. The pastors will greet you outside on the porches.

We hope to evaluate and edit these precautions when vaccination rates continue to increase, COVID (and variant) numbers continue to decrease, and guidelines are updated for churches and our region. There is no guarantee of complete safety from transmission of the COVID-19 virus, but we will continue to do our best to keep our members, friends, and families as safe as possible.

Invitation

L: Everyone is welcome to this meal of love and grace. You should have received communion elements when you arrived at the welcome table with a cracker and grape juice, or if you are joining us from home, we invite you to grab a piece of bread or a cracker and some juice/wine or water.

L: And so we gather at the table.

*COMMUNION PRAYER

L: May God be with you

And also with you!

L: Lift up your hearts

We lift them up to God!

L: Let us give thanks to God most high.

It is right to give God thanks and praise!

L: O Holy One, Breath of our Life, Originator of Grace, Source of Limitless Love, We thank you for our brother, Jesus, who showed us how to love our neighbor by speaking openly with a despised woman at noontime; for healing a blind outcast who had almost given up hope; for feeding 5,000 travelers with a miracle of generosity; by working through a Samaritan who helped a stranger who had been beaten, robbed; for reminding us that the greatest law is to love your neighbor as yourself. We thank you for our friend, Jesus, who called on us to love your children. We thank you for your creation that surrounds us with beauty and with what we need for life: remind us in this meal that we are called to steward it faithfully and justly.

*JESUS' WORDS AT HIS LAST SUPPER

L: We remember the stories that Jesus' friends tell, stories of bread broken and shared, feeding a multitude, stories of being gathered together, enemy and friend, around tables, stories of unlikely guests revealing the face of the sacred.

They say that that it was on a night of both celebration and betrayal that he took the bread leftover on the table, blessed it and broke it; reminding them that it is in the breaking that we become whole, in losing our lives that we find them, in serving that we are served. As the grain scattered becomes one in the loaf, when we eat this bread, we become one with one another.

They say that he took the cup also leftover on the table, poured out and sharing, remembering with them, the life-giving breath

even now pounding a rhythm through our veins, the breath of life from whence we come the breath that precedes and follows all that we can see As the grapes find life in the vine, when we drink this cup.

we become at one with the source of life itself
