### **Crossing the Threshold**

Leader: Ahhh... here we are again, friends, and for the last time sitting in a time of contemplation together. As this series draws to a close, I want to encourage you to continue this practice at home if it has resonated with you, giving you a bit of respite and calm. Here on January 1, the threshold of a New Year, it is appropriate for us to settle in and start this calendar year with aligning ourselves in the quiet with the reflection of the sacred within us so that we might be inspired to be God's Sacred Doing in this world.

I invite you to get comfortable where you are sitting. I invite you to open your hands upward in your lap. Close your eyes if you are comfortable doing so and take a deep, intentional breath in and out. If it is difficult to get your mind to quiet down, if you are making shopping lists in there, it's OK. Don't judge it... just take another breath and "thank and excuse" for just a mo-

ment the tasks that might be popping up on the to-do list in your brain. That's it. Take time to settle in.

Bring to your mind's eye—to your memory and imagination—a time of day that you love. Is there a moment in your day where you get to catch a breath in some alone time? Or is it that you love the moment you see your kids after school? Or perhaps it is cooking in your kitchen or watering plants or some other simple, ordinary, moment. As you see this scene, put it in slow motion. Now imagine particles of light showering slowly upon it. Let this reflection of light be an anointing of hope for seeing more and more of life through the lens of the Sacred. Continue to just breathe, listen, and see with your heart.



### Introduction to Scripture

Reader: We've looked through the lens of the sacred and have experienced time, people, places, others, and ourselves as God's holy love reflected and incarnate in the world. Because of the experience of God's action of love toward us, we are called also to act, the "sacred doing" of alleviating suffering wherever it is found. We dedicate ourselves in this New Year to sacred acts of justice and mercy, bringing grace to a hurting world, reflecting the sacred in all we do. Hear this first reading:

### First Reading

Isaiah 63: 7-9 (NRSVUE)

Reader: I will recount the gracious deeds of the Lord, the praiseworthy acts of the Lord, because of all that the Lord has done for us and the great favor to the house of Israel that he has shown them according to his mercy, according to the abundance of his steadfast love. For he said, "Surely they are my people, children who will not act deceitfully," and he became their savior in all their distress.

It was no messenger or angel but his presence that saved them; in his love and pity it was he who redeemed them; he lifted them up and carried them all the days of old.

### **Second Reading**

Matthew 2: 13-23 (NRSVUE)

Reader: Now after [the magi] had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt and

remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, "Out of Egypt I have called my son."

When Herod saw that he had been tricked by the magi, he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had learned from the magi. Then what had been spoken through the prophet Jeremiah was fulfilled:

"A voice was heard in Ramah, wailing and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children;

she refused to be consoled, because they are no more."

When Herod died, an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who were seeking the child's life are dead." Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was ruling Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. And after being warned in a dream, he went away to the district of Galilee. There he made his home in a town called Nazareth, so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, "He will be called a Nazarene."


