Welcome to Union UCC and Worship Today! Our worship theme: Do Unto Others

Just as water reflects the face, so one human heart reflects another. – Proverbs 27:19

Our world seems to be consumed with division—often typified in the colors red and blue. Rather than stay in our monochromatic silos, the Golden Rule in scripture challenges us to engage in conversation and seek to create whatever common good we can with our relatives, friends, and neighbors who we might consider to be on the "other side" politically and ideologically. As we attempt to come together, the idea is not that we are obliterating either one or trying to change each other, but rather we discover the beauty that can be created when we work together to make the world a better place. The "purple space" is where we cultivate kindness, compassion, humility, respect, and love for one another and for the good of all the world, no matter what.

Re-Orientation

Leader: Today, we continue our worship series that points us toward connection in a world of divisions. The root of the word "human" is the same as the word "humility." It all means literally "on the ground." From dust we came, and to dust we shall return. When we hear each other's fears, anxieties, and pain, we can return to the ground of hope... that we are all experiencing the pains of being human. This week, we remember to look first at our neighbor as a person, not a position. Beginning conversations this way may help us to stay

human and "on the ground" with one another rather than needing to come out "on top."

Scripture

Ephesians 4: 1-6, NRSVUE

Reader: Sometimes even if we find it hard to believe, we must claim as truth the Gospel good news. Together, we find ways to tell deeply good news for all people by filtering our interactions through the lens of humility. Today's scripture speaks of approaching one another with "all humility, gentleness, and patience." What we put into the world is part of the ongoing creation of the world. Notice the scripture doesn't say that unity requires agreement, but rather we are to cultivate the qualities that equip us to live in unity regardless of agreement. Can we begin to believe this is possible?

Scripture Reader: I, therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace: there is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith,

one baptism, one God and [Parent] of all, who is above all and through all and in all.

Reader: A word of God for our times.

People: **Thanks be to God.**
