

Gospel Lesson

Luke 5: 1-11

Reader: The Gospel of Luke gives us the numbers as crowds continue to follow the movements of Jesus and his popularity and notoriety spread. So many were crammed on the

shores of the lake that he had to get some distance in a boat in order to speak to them. The crowd size is then mirrored in the size of the surprise catch of fish that happens when the "sermon" is over. Fishermen become followers. We, like them, are invited to use our gifts to demonstrate the abundance of God's economy, filling our days with meaning. Hear this word from the 5th chapter of Luke:

Once while Jesus was standing beside the Lake of Gennesaret and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gotten out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets."

When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to burst. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink.


But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus's knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" For he and all who were with him were astounded at the catch of fish that they had taken, and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who are partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people."

When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

This is a Word of God reminding us that we can never out-spendthe moments of meaningfulness that can fill us in these days.



Leader: In the economy of Jesus, we find abundance in the

most unlikely places. We ask for God's guidance to discern when we need to change direction or try things differently. We find abundant meaning in the midst of life's uncertainties when we look to Jesus.



Leader: Each week of this series we will be focusing on naming gifts of abundance we have received in the week, instances where we have seen the abundance of Christ at work in the world, and we will ask for the wisdom and strength to change so that abundance is more available to all.

There are notecards in your bulletin, if you wish to do so, you are invited in the pause between these petitions to write your abundance observations and place them in the Offering plate. We will add them to the canister on the Altar as a sign of thanksgiving and commitment.

In this pause, O God, we ponder the many gifts you have given us. Our gratitude seems never enough for the plenty you provide. We call to mind the gifts of creation, of relationships, of sustenance.

In this pause, Christ Jesus, we ponder the ways your love is still at work in the world. Our awe and wonder at the goodness of others is profound.

We call to mind acts of kindness, generosity, and selflessness.

In this pause, Holy Spirit, we come asking you for strength. The temptation to live by the economics of not-enough is so strong in us. We ask for revelation in our thinking and doing, so that we might live with hope in the house.

Loving God, Christ Jesus, Holy Spirit, we are yours. We bring to you now the concerns of our day, of our communities, knowing that already you are present, already you are working to bring about comfort and healing. Today we pray for....
