

In Galatians, the Apostle Paul encourages followers of Jesus to generously help and care for others. Though there is great need in the world and we can grow weary because we do not know how to help, God's spirit energizes us to help.

You can make a difference. Your generosity makes all the difference. Your gifts to OGHS provide immediate aid and long-term support to people experiencing hunger, thirst, disaster, or crisis around the world.

Collections for OGHS will take place in June, to make a donation, please use the special envelope included in this newsletter. This may be mailed to the church office, or dropped into the collection plate. Donations may also be made online.

From the Mission Committee

Thank you for your generous support during the Easter Mission collection. Donations of over \$1,350 will support Parkland C.A.R.E.S and over \$1,350 will support the YMCA Warming Station program in Allentown. Both missions will provide love and support to local families, our financial support definitely makes a difference in the community.

Each year, earnings from the Urffer Fund in the Funds of Lasting Gifts is provided to missions outside of the church who deal with improving the lives of children.

This year the Mission Committee approved \$720 to sponsor two young adult girls living in Zimbabwe, Africa, though the Church World Service program. Miracle League of the Lehigh Valley will receive \$875 and My Stuff Bags Foundation will receive \$800 to support their mission to provide bags of new belongings to children rescued from abuse, homelessness and neglect in the US.

Each year, earnings from the Mattern Family Humanitarian Needs Fund is provided to missions across the globe to provide families some of the basic requirements of food, clean water and shelter.

This year the Mission Committee has approved for \$1,000 donations to Veteran's Outreach of Pennsylvania and the Guatemala UCC Water Project. \$500 donations will be provided to Meals on Wheels of the Lehigh Valley, Maui Food Bank, and the Northeast Community Center Food Pantry in Bethlehem.

Thank you to the Urffer Fund and the Mattern Fund, individual funds within the Funds of Lasting Gifts endowment fund for Spreading God's Love to the World.

"For the first time, all four Pennsylvania conferences of the UCC will be gathering for a shared Meeting on June 7-9, 2024 at The Penn Stater in State College, PA. We will have shared worship, workshops, meals and meetings as well as each conference's separate business meeting.

Below is a letter from the four PA UCC Conference Ministers **about this year's Summer Meeting:** The planning committee for the Keystone State UCC Conference Summer Meeting has been working diligently to prepare for our June 7-9 meeting. The Keystone Working Group in collaboration with the Conference Ministers have been seeking grants and additional funding to assist with the costs of the meeting.

We want you to know that YOUR attendance is vitally important to us. We need you to help us plan for the future of our conferences. Our General Minister and President, the Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson will be with us on Saturday and Sunday, and we hope you will be with us to meet her and worship with her on Sunday.

The costs for this meeting will be significantly higher than our usual conference meetings. For one thing, this is a 3-day meeting and incorporates the extensive use of technology and the Penn Stater multiple room assignments for our gathering. We do not want the cost of the event to prevent anyone from attending. Therefore, we are increasing our scholarship funds to cover the cost of the registration. The registration materials (which are forthcoming) include some links for additional hotel locations, should you choose to utilize them. Also, we want you to know that our meetings as a Keystone Conference will likely be shorter and less costly.

Please make plans to join us in State College in June and celebrate the work we are doing together, because we believe "Together We Are Stronger."


Meditation and Prayer Gatherings with Pastor Kris

Pastor Carrie's Corner

Wisdom Tips for talking about Mental Health

Be a friend: "A friend loves at all times..." (Proverbs 17:17a). Listen without judgment. Provide companionship. Offer a ride or a meal. Respect confidentiality. Avoid shame and guilt. Remember that we all are impacted by mental health.

Remember that words can hurt: "Rash words are like sword thrusts..." (Proverbs 12:18a). Pay attention to the words you use and how they affect the people around you. Avoid labelling and stereotyping people.

Stop the stigma: "We, who are many, are one body in Christ" (Romans 12:5). Challenge negative attitudes toward mental health and neurodiversity whenever you encounter it. Question your assumptions. Correct misinformation about mental health challenges, substance use disorders, trauma, and brain differences.

Educate: "Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice?" (Proverbs 8:1). Learn the facts about the various challenges that can affect mental health, including substance use and brain disorders, neurodevelopmental difference, trauma. Realize that mental health is physical health.
