

November 10 Veterans Sundays When we remember those who have died during their time of service to our country.


November 17 Festival Choir Sunday Matt Gerry will lead our musicians and many from the Gerry Music Studio and community in a Sunday filled with beautiful music.





A few minor repairs were made around the property this summer. In addition to the normal servicing of the air conditioning units, two other repairs were needed to the sanctuary units, the office units, and the choir room units. Once finished, the air conditioning units were all working well to keep the staff, the guests, and worshippers cool during this hot summer.

A major leak in the underground water line leading over to the grove was repaired early this summer, just in time for all of the summer events in the grove. Blessings to the Funds of Lasting Gifts endowment fund for providing funds to make these major repairs.

Lastly, a BIG shout out to our caretakers Ori and Shelly Handwerk, who have been hard at work all summer to clean and wax all of the tile floors and clean all the rugs around the church property, including the preschool floors. There is a major amount of furniture moving involved to empty a room, clean and wax the floors, and then return all of the tables, chairs, and other odds and ends to their proper location. From the Cemetery Commission

Part-time employment opportunities are available for caring for the Union Church Cemetery. UNION UCC - (5) for (5)

At the Penn Northeast Conference meeting in June 2024, Union UCC was recognized as being one of thirty churches within the PNEC that are (5) for (5) churches which is a pretty big deal! That means that Union UCC supports, through individual members, the general budget and FOLG, all (5) of the (5) special offerings of the national UCC. Thay are listed, and how each one is funded, below for your information:

<u>Our Church's Wider Mission</u> – Basic Support - [OCWM] – Goes to the Conference and they send 10% to the National Church to support their ministries

<u>One Great Hour of Sharing</u> [OGHS] – Goes to the National Church to help people in crisis by providing sources of clean water, education, health care, refugee resettlement, emergency relief and disaster preparedness, to name a few

<u>Neighbors in Need</u> [NIN] – Goes to the National Church to support ministries of justice and compassion through advocacy efforts and justice initiatives

<u>Strengthen the Church</u> – [STC] - ½ goes to the National Church; ½ to the PNEC to support leadership development, new churches, youth ministry and innovation in existing congregations

<u>Christmas Fund</u> — this is the charitable arm of the UCC Pension Boards and it provides direct financial support to those who serve the church and are facing financial difficulties

OCWM is included in the general budget, plus an extra gift through FOLG; **OGHS** is collected from member donations in June; **NIN** is collected from member donations in August. The **Strengthen the Church** and **Christmas Fund** are included in the general budget, payable each December.

Pennsylvania Conferences of the United Church of Christ Met at Penn State in June – from Pastor Kris

Our church's delegates and visitors were Doug Brace, Janice Metzger, Rev. Bill Metzger, and Pastor Kris. Here are some reflections of the event and work that is being done. They will be representing us again at the voting meeting on Saturday, November 9th along with Pastor Kayli. Thank you Doug, Janice, and Bill for doing this good and important work on our behalf.

From Doug Brace:

On Friday, June 7th through Sunday, June 9th I attended the gathering of the four Pennsylvania conferences of the United Church of Christ at the Penn Stater Hotel & Conference Center in State College. I did this as the alternate delegate of Union UCC. I would like to thank the leaders and members of Union UCC for supporting me in this capacity. This gathering was filled with time for worship, education, discussion, and fellowship with our UCC siblings across Pennsylvania. I attended workshops on (1) technology tools and boundaries, (2) white Christian nationalism, and (3) being church in an evolving world. During all of these opportunities, attendees talked about their joys and concerns and listened to presentations and asked questions about the proposal to merge the four Pennsylvania Conferences into a unified Keystone Conference. This time of discernment understandably leads to moments of uncertainty but also excitement for everything that can happen when we - the church, and all of its people and entities - come together as disciples of Jesus Christ to do justice. Personally, I look forward to all of the possibilities related to merging Penn Northeast, Penn Southeast, Penn Central, and Penn West to form the Keystone Conference and look towards God for guidance and inspiration as we all work (including you) together to do the church's work.


From Janice Metzger:

I had the privilege of being a delegate to the All UCC PA Conferences meeting at State College 6/7-6/9. I was looking forward to this meeting to gauge the reaction of delegates/visitors/pastors to the proposed merger of all four PA Conferences into one Conference, the Keystone Conference.

In addition to worship, workshops and individual Conference meetings, there were several presentations on the decision process of merging into one Conference, time for questions at each session as well as an evening session on Saturday devoted solely to questions/concerns regarding the process and merger. All in all, I felt encouraged by the response to the merger. All questions asked, or concerns raised, were things that had been discussed and had an answer, or it was on the docket yet to be determined. Nothing was brought up that had not already been addressed or wasn't on the table yet to be addressed. A 'straw vote' taken at the Saturday evening Q&A session, revealed the vast majority were in favor of the merger.

I am hopeful that this merger will pass in November and look forward to the new possibilities and opportunities that will exist in all of us working together to be Christ's hands and feet in this world. If we merge into the Keystone Conference, we will have the opportunity for ideas to be shared, the ability to pool resources and access to the gifts/ expertise of others across the Commonwealth.

Another plus for me was seeing people from each of the four Conferences. It felt almost like a 'mini-Synod' to me, in that I got a sense of the wider church, beyond Union and the Penn Northeast Conference. Members from our partner church in India were there, which added to the 'mini-Synod' feel of the wider, global reach of the UCC. It was particularly nice to have the General Minister and President of the UCC, Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson in attendance to hear her views on the merger and have her preach at worship on Sunday morning. I look forward to more Keystone Conference meetings in the future!!



Pastor Carrie's Corner

My roles as Pastor of Visitation and hospital chaplain often lead me to discussions about "the really hard things" in life, and one of these is end-of-life care, or hospice. Here are some myths that palliative doctors are sharing in an article* about the extended hospice care for President Jimmy Carter in the hope of easing fear or confusion. As always, I am happy to visit with you!

Myth 1: Hospice is for people who have "given up." Hospice is very often the opposite and actually increases the amount of care and support available, for patients living at home or settings such as independent and assisted living.

Myth 2: Hospice care is for people with days to live. As Carter demonstrates, patients may have weeks or months to live.

Myth 3: Hospice care involves 24/7 bedside care by medical professionals. The bulk of the day-to-day caregiving responsibilities remain with the family, private caregivers or nursing home staff. Hospice is a form of care, not necessarily a place.

Myth 4: Hospice accelerates the dying process. The hospice philosophy is to provide comfort and compassionate care for people living with terminal illness, for however long that may be.
