Mission Thank you from Allentown Warming Station

We hope this message finds you well. we wanted to take a moment to extend our gratitude to you to the congregation o Union UCC for your generous gift to the Allentown Warming Station last April. Your support means so much to us, especially during the coldest months, when the need is so great.

This season, we have seen a 18.38% increase in the number of individuals seeking shelter, and over 2,300 meals have already been served. The Y's Warming Station is committed to providing a safe and welcoming place for those facing homelessness, and just last week, we saw the highest number of occupants to date. With 60 beds available, we welcomed 70 guests, turning away no one. To accommodate this increased need, we implemented cots in the hallway to ensure everyone had a place to rest.

Thank you again for your critical support in making this possible. Your kindness is truly helping us continue to serve our neighbors in their time of need.

Keystone Conference News

The transition towards the Keystone Conference is in full swing. Town Hall meetings were held in March and April and much work is being done in preparation for the merger. One final step for approval will be when the proposal will be taken up this July by the UCC General Synod 35 in Kansas City, MO. I will communicate the results of that vote then.

In the meantime, here are some key points about how the financial situation will change after Keystone is ratified: [Note: PNEC will not be a Conference anymore but will be an Association]

- For **2025**, congregational and Individual gifts to OCWM funds stay in the PNEC and fund our staffing, programs. And support from Congregational or Individual gifts to *Friends of PNEC* for **2025** also stay in PNEC to support conference programming.
- For **2026**, Congregational and Individual gifts to OCWM funds will go to the Keystone Conference for staffing, program and support; but Congregational and Individual gifts to *Friends of the Association* (was Conference) in **2026** will stay with PNE to provide funding for association programming and services.
- Support for Committee on Ministry work in 2025 is supported by PNEC while support for Committee on Ministry work in 2026 is supported by the Keystone Conference

ALSO - IN PNEC

We, Union UCC, will be hosting members of the PNEC at their Spring meeting on Saturday, May 3, 2025! Doug Brace and I will be Union UCC delegates to that meeting.

Monday, March 17, 2025, Consistory Actions:

These notes reflect items that needed action and approval by Consistory. Standing and routine items are reported by Committees and Staff throughout the newsletter. A complete copy of the Consistory minutes can be found in the church office.

- Request from Property & Maintenance to approve funds from FOLG for winter damage in the grove and for office furniture for Pastor of Visitation
- Request from Mission to approve funds from the Urffer Fund for Special Olympics, Bethany Children's Home, & Civic |
 Theater Children's Camp and for funds from the Mattern Humanitarian Fund for Parkland CARES, Meals on Wheels,
 Lehigh Conference of Churches, Community Action of the LV, Second Harvest, Sixth Street Shelter & Victory House
- Church & Ministry requested approval for vacations for Pastor Kris 5/31/25-6/7/25 and for Pastor Kayli 7/28/25-8/3/25. They also requested approval for Susan Glosan becoming a Member in Discernment with PNEC for pursuing Ordination.
- Request from Financial Leadership Team to approve funds from the Mattern Music Fund for the bands for Faith and Food Trucks this summer and from the Non-designated Fund for start-up event costs for same

All of the above requests were approved unanimously.

From the Mission Committee

May Missions - Cereal - Cereal - Cereal

The special mission project for the whole month of May is to collect boxed cereals for the Northern Lehigh Food Bank. Every Summer, the food bank provides extra kid's packs to the children of local food bank families, stuffed with peanut butter, jelly, soup, canned fruit, and lots of extra goodies. Each supporting church of the food bank provides certain goodies to make over 120 kid's pack.

This year, in addition to our normal goodies, Union UCC will be providing 2 extra boxes of cereal to each child. Our challenge to you is to fill the shopping cart and the foyer area of the church with CEREAL, all brands, all flavors, all box sizes. Our goal is to collect a minimum of 300 boxes of CEREAL, can we do this? YES, we can. Start shopping now and bring to church the whole month of May.

Each box of cereal goes a long way in providing nutrition to children during the summer months. You do make a difference. Thank you, the Mission Committee.

Chemo Bag packing event

Union UCC will hold a Chemo Bag packing event on Sunday April 27 after the 10:30 service in Memorial Hall. We held a successful event two years ago in honor of Veronica Fabian, so we decided to hold another packing event this year. The plan is to pack 200 Chemo Bags which will then go to patients in the Lehigh Valley area upon their first chemotherapy visit. Union UCC will provide the needed funds for the Chemo Bag organization to purchase all of the supplies needed to make 200 bags.



Donate, Recycle and Help Your Church

As you are cleaning out closets and cabinets be sure to keep Union UCC in mind. Bring your donations at any time to the bin in our grove. The church receives a certain amount of money for each pound that is donated. Items that are usable are resold or recycled. You are also helping to save the amount of things that end up in a landfill by donating your items this way. Recycle Local's goal is to help agencies have 0% waste.

Items accepted include: clean and dry clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, towels, drapes, pillow cases and stuffed animals. Place all items in plastic bags. NO furniture, rags, pillows, toys, or household goods.
